GENERAL INFORMATION

ABOUT CAMP MONTICELLO

At Camp Monticello, we strongly believe that each child is an individual with their interest and passion. We foster our students to build on their prior knowledge and expand their learning by allowing them to make choices in what they want to further develop. This year, Monticello Academy is offering a summer school program in conjunction with our Camp Monticello. Students can enroll in Camp Monticello only, or Camp Monticello and Summer School combined.

When students attend Camp Monticello, they are divided into three categories:

- Current Kindergarten
- Current 1st-2nd Grade
- Current 3rd and Up-Grade

Due to COVID compliances, this year we will have three sessions available for parents:

- Session 1 June 1st June 25th
- Session 2 June 28th July 23rd
- Session 3 July 26th August 11th

CAMPS AND SUMMER SCHOOL COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOL

- ➤ MASK REQUIREMENTS Students are expected to wear facial masks on campus at all times unless they are eating or drinking. A six feet distance is required once the mask is removed. Students are expected to have at least TWO extra masks in their backpacks.
- SOCIAL DISTANCING Inside the classroom during instructional time, students are three feet within distance. When they are outside, they must maintain a six feet distance at all times.
- > STABLE COHORTS Children are assigned in their stable cohorts throughout the camp's duration. There is no switching of the cohort.
- SCREENING Before entering the campus or classroom, students are expected to do the following:
 - o Temperature check
 - o Complete health survey
 - Wash their hands
- > SCHOOL CAMPUS Due to COVID guidelines, no visitors or parents are allowed on the school campus unless you have a preschool child.



- ARRIVAL AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES: Parents are to drop off and pick up their child in the school parking lot where the signs are located. When you are here to pick up your child, please call the school in advance, and we will walk your child out to you.
- ➤ CAMP MEAL PROVISION: Meals are served individually. There is no sharing of food. Any students who bring lunch from home must be nut-sensitive. Monticello Academy will provide the following:
 - o AM and PM Snacks: Snack is served at approximately 10:30AM and 3:30PM.
 - Lunch: It is served at approximately 12:30PM.
- ➤ ILLNESS POLICY: COVID-19 Symptoms can affect different people in different ways. Infected people have had a wide range of symptoms reported from mild symptoms to severe illness. If your child is experiencing any ONE OR MORE of these symptoms today or within the past 24 hours, please stay home and seek medical care and testing immediately. Campers cannot return to campus unless they have done a COVID-19 PCR Test, and the result is negative. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Any communicable diseases must be reported to the administrative office immediately.
 - As a school policy, if your child is unable to participate in the daily function of the camp, then they should not be at school.

> TRAVEL ADVISORY

- All travelers arriving in or returning to California from other states or countries should follow CDC travel guidance.
- All travelers who test positive or develop <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> should <u>isolate</u> and follow <u>public health recommendations</u>.
- Fully vaccinated travelers:
 - are less likely to get and spread COVID-19, and can travel safely within the United States and California
 - should follow <u>CDC travel guidance</u>, and are not required to test or quarantine before or after travel unless they have symptoms concerning COVID-19 disease.



- Non-Essential Travel of unvaccinated persons: Except in connection with essential travel,
 Californians should avoid non-essential travel outside of California, to other states or
 countries unless they are fully vaccinated. Avoiding travel reduces the risk of virus
 transmission, including by reducing the risk that new sources of infection and, potentially,
 new virus strains will be introduced to California.
 - Non-essential travelers from other states or countries are strongly discouraged from entering California, and should adhere to the quarantine procedures set forth below.
 - Non-essential travelers who are not fully vaccinated:
 - should get tested with a viral test 1-3 days before travel and get tested 3-5 days upon arrival to their destination.
 - They should stay home and self-quarantine for a full 7 days after travel, even if their test is negative.
 - Non-essential travelers who are not fully vaccinated and don't get tested:
 - Should stay home and <u>self-quarantine</u> for 10 days after travel.

CAMP INFORMATION

- ➤ **CAMP TIME:** All-day camp is from 9:00AM 5:30PM. Campers are expected to be at Monticello Academy by 9:00AM, which is the start time of all camps.
- ➤ HOLIDAY CLOSURE: Monticello Academy will be closed on Monday, July 5th in honor of the 4th of July celebration.

> CAMP COUNSELORS:

- During summer, our after-school teachers will be the counselors for Camp Monticello depending on the camps and their specialty, they will be assigned to work in the specific themes.
- > AGE REQUIREMENT: Current kindergarten through Middle School
- ➤ **LEADING BY EXAMPLE:** At Camp Monticello, our main goal is to facilitate a positive perception of learning and developing lasting memories of the camp experience. Our camp counselors are chosen for their maturity, skills, patience, passion, and enthusiasm for making a difference in children's lives. Each counselor is trained in CPR and First Aid that places heavy emphasis on maintaining a safe environment to prevent any major accidents. Minor accidents, such as bumps and bruises or cuts, may occur as a result of our active activities. Camp counselors will keep close supervision on all activities and model appropriate behaviors for the children.
- ➤ **CUBBIES:** All cubbies are for day use only. Every student is expected to clean out the cubbies at the end of the day. Do not leave anything behind. There are no assigned cubbies.
- > SUNSCREEN: If you want your child to apply sunscreen daily, please make sure you submit a sunscreen permission slip and your child's sunscreen, labeled with his/her name on it.
- ➤ **ABSENCES:** If your child will be on vacation or out sick for the day, please notify the administration at attendance@monticelloacademy.org or camp counselors so we can better plan for the day.



- ➤ **MEDICATION:** A medication form, completed by the parents or legal guardian, is required if your child needs any medication to be applied or provided during their day at Monticello Academy. Medicine can only be dispensed out of its original container with the child's name and prescription. Please remember that at Monticello Academy, it is required for the parent to take medication home at the end of each day. Exceptions to this requirement are medications such as Epi-Pens and Nebulizers. Special circumstances need to be in written form with a doctor's note, so the medication can be kept at school.
- ACCIDENT REPORTS: Any time that your child is hurt you will receive an accident report, telling you the nature of the accident. Depending on the severity of the accident, we may notify you by phone. All accident reports will be emailed to you to be signed and returned to us immediately. Please scan and send it back to you.
- **COMMUNICATION:** There are various ways to communicate with camp counselors:

- ➤ **GUIDANCE PLAN:** During summer camp, there are clear set boundaries. Part of disciplining children is guidance. When students have a conflict, we do not immediately intervene unless they are hurting each other. We will observe first and allow the students to resolve their problems. However, if the students are unable to resolve, then there are several techniques that we often use. They are as follow:
 - Redirection: Directing them to a more positive behavior or action, such as if you want to hit something, why not hit a ball. Students are always encouraged to show they are sorry rather than saying sorry to each other. Actions speak more than words.
 - Reasoning: Having a conversation and explaining to students through the use of logic and discussion about different scenarios. Role-playing generally helps students understand other's perspectives.
 - Loss of privileges: Student's privileges are removed when they have been warned at least once or twice. Privileges are removed for the day or until further notice depending on the severity of the action.
 - Taking a break from the stimulation: Sometimes giving students time to themselves can help them regroup and think about what had just happened. We allow them to sit in a quiet area to ponder about their action and how they can react differently. When they are ready, they will come to us for discussion. Having a discussion is very important as a follow-up to their break.



- Choice: Students are given only two choices at a time. The choices are conducive to what we are trying to encourage at that moment and are positive.
- o **Positive Reinforcement:** Catching them while they are at their best through praises and words of encouragement can go a long way.
- Warning: Everyone is given at least one warning before actions are taken. We need
 to maintain consistency and follow through before anything can be effective with the
 students.

These techniques will help the students learn to cope with conflicts more effectively through the usage of words rather than physical. In talking with the students, the words are very simple and straight to the point.

- PAYMENT OF FEES: Payment is due upon registration. All parents are expected to register online. New parents will have to complete paperwork with Administration. No students are allowed to attend the camp without pre-payment. Payments are non-refundable, non-prorated, or non-transferable.
- CAMP ENROLLMENT CAPACITY: Each camp is grouped in no more than 20 students with 1 camp counselor.
- CAMP SWITCHING: Switching of camp selections can be accommodated based on availability. Please email the camp director.
- CANCELLATION: Camp will only be canceled if we are mandated to do Shelter-in-Place or if there is a lack of enrollment. In that case, fees will be credited or refunded. There will be no refund if you decide to withdraw or cancel.

CAMP MONTICELLO SESSIONS

Due to COVID-19 and its restrictions on social distancing, we had to change the infrastructure of our program. Our camps are based on a 4-week camp program. This year, the camps are broken down into six different categories:

1. 4-Week Innovative Technology Camp



- 2. Session 1: 4-Week Camp Monticello
- 3. Session 2: 4-Week Camp Monticello
- 4. Session 3: 2-Week Camp Monticello
- 5. 4-Week Summer School / Camp Monticello
- 6. 4-Week Summer School / Camp Monticello

Each camp will have a small group setting with a camp counselor.

FOUR-WEEK INNOVATIVE TECHNOLOGY CAMPS - 2ND GRADE AND UP

Week 1 (June 1st – June 4th) – Minecraft:

- In Minecraft: Education Edition, campers will learn to solve problems, puzzles, and mazes
 while also using computational thinking to program using MIT's visual programming
 language, Scratch.
- Students can build almost anything from their imaginations and learn to collaborate within virtual spaces.
- Explore video game design, level design, coding, and much other Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM)-related skills.

Week 2 AND 3 (June 7th - June 18th) - Lego Robotics:

- Campers will work in small teams to overcome challenges based on real-world problems using Lego's EV3 Mindstorms and its visual programming language.
- This year's challenge will be focused on city construction through STEM practices.

Week 4 (June 21st - June 26th) - Drone Pilot in Training

- Prepare to take flight and explore in all three dimensions with drones. Campers will learn how to program and command drones, mirroring their usage in the real world.
- Campers will also explore the history and physics behind drones and discuss the increasing importance and change they are bringing to our world.
- This year will focus on the difficulties of maneuvering in a three-dimensional environment, as well as the exploration of programming with a pre-constructed robot.

SESSION 1: FOUR-WEEK CAMP – KINDERGARTEN

Week 1 (June 1st – June 4th) – Ocean Discoveries

- How do polar bears stay warm in freezing cold water? During the camp, children will find out and solve other deep mysteries of the sea.
- They will discover different ocean zones and what animals live there.
- Campers will also take a virtual field trip to an aquarium to learn more about the ocean animals.

Week 2 (June 7th - June 11th) - Wild World of Sports

 Campers will focus on a different sport each day, such as soccer, track and field, and basketball.



They will also design a new sport of their own and demonstrate how to play it.

Week 3 (June 14th – June 18th) – Under the Stars

- How big is the universe? This week is all about the solar system and the universe. Each planet has its characteristics and let's learn all about them!
- Campers will create a planetarium inside the classroom, and take a virtual field trip to a real planetarium.

Week 4 (June 21st – June 25th) – Farming Exploration

- Campers will learn about farming and how we benefit from it. They will discover the importance of farm animals and learn to grow plants.
- We will be taking a virtual field trip to a farm.
- At the end of the week, children can come in dressed as farmers.

SESSION 1: FOUR-WEEK CAMP - 1ST GRADE AND 2ND GRADE

Week 1 (June 1st - June 4th) - Imaginative Gallery

This week, let the campers' imagination flow. They will craft and paint in a wide array of styles
and materials. We will be exploring bubble painting, painting with baking soda, paper
weaving, and many more.

Week 2 (June 7th – June 11th) – Ocean Discoveries

- What does seaweed taste like? It looks like a sheet of paper, would it taste like it too? Let's find out this week during our seaweed tasting.
- Campers will discover different ocean zones and what animals live there.
- They will also take a virtual field trip to an aquarium to learn more about the ocean animals.

Week 3 (June 14th - June 18th) - The Creative Pod

- What is more fun than creating unique and personalized items with your hands?
- Campers will learn new techniques and make a collection of fun projects, such as keychains, sleep masks, bows/bow ties, and friendship bracelets.

Week 4 (June 21st – June 25th) – Kiddie Foodies

- Bon Apetit! Campers will spend the week cooking up a storm. They will be making soft pretzels, churro waffles, and many more delicious treats.
- Campers will also learn about basic culinary skills, kitchen safety, and proper food handling to make them better chefs.



SESSION 1: FOUR-WEEK CAMP - 3rd GRADE AND OLDER

Week 1 (June 1st – June 4th) AND Week 2 (June 7th – June 11th) – Starlight Theater: Alice in Wonderland

- Campers will learn theatre basics, such as improvisation, vocal training, dancing, and puppetry.
- They will utilize puppets and masks to show the expressions of their characters.
- An audition will be held on the first day of camp to assess your child's skills and cast for the show. Scripts will be sent one week before camp starts.
- Rehearsals will be recorded and edited. The final performance will be shared with all families.

Week 3 (June 14th – June 18th) – Dance Expressions

- We will focus on learning a K-Pop routine throughout the week and the final performance will be recorded and sent out to all families.
- Different dance challenges, Zumba, and workouts will also be explored.

Week 4 (June 21st - June 25th) - Creative Hearts

- Campers will explore a different style of art every day: sketch, contemporary, and sculpting to
 just name a few.
- Join us for a virtual Art Walk on Friday afternoon to see your child's masterpieces.

SESSION 2: FOUR-WEEK CAMP – KINDERGARTEN

Week 1 (June 28th - July 2nd) - Dinosaurs Roar!

- What was the biggest dinosaur and which one was the fastest? Campers will be learning about prehistoric animals and their roles on Earth.
- They will be making their fossils and warning signs with their favorite dinosaurs.

Week 2 (July 6th - July 9th) - Mad Science

- Science is FUN! Children will be making observations, generating hypotheses, and testing them. All of their STEM skills and scientistic minds will be used during hands-on activities.
- They will make their clouds, watch water walk on a paper towel, and many more.

Week 3 (July 12th – July 16th) – Music Discoveries

- Campers will learn basic elements of music and explore various genres of music such as classical, hip-hop, and rock.
- They will get to explore a guitar and a turntable in class and make musical instruments of their own.

Week 4 (July 19th - July 23rd) - Rainforest Expeditions

- Children will focus on the living conditions and numerous habitats in the rainforest.
- They will learn about the rich and unique species in the rainforest ecosystem.
- The fun and colorful nature will inspire the children when making many creative craft projects.



SESSION 2: FOUR-WEEK CAMP - 1ST GRADE AND 2ND GRADE

Week 1 (June 28th - July 2nd) - Cake N' Bake

- Ready for THE best sugar cookie? Campers will find out just how to make one this week.
 They will be baking both sweet and savory treats throughout this camp.
- Children will learn a wide range of culinary skills, such as baking techniques, kitchen safety, and proper food handling to help take our campers' baking skills to the next level.

Week 2 (July 6th – July 9th) – Summer Olympics Fun

- Everyone can be an athlete as long as they want to be. Campers will explore different sports such as basketball and balloon tennis.
- Besides playing sports, they will learn about team spirits and new fun facts about sports.
- Olympics-inspired craft projects will also be the campers' favorites this week.

Week 3 (July 12th – July 16th) – Aloha Adventures

- Aloha~ Welcome to paradise! Campers will experience and learn different aspects of Hawaii: their language, attire, nature, and more.
- They will get to design their tiki mask, build a tropical paradise, and create a volcanic eruption painting in a bag.

Week 4 (July 19th - July 23rd) - Twist, Tie & Dye!

- You don't have to pick only one favorite color when you can have them all this week!
- Campers will make everything tie-dye, from shirts and socks to cookies and pancakes. We will turn this camp colorful and magical.

SESSION 2: FOUR-WEEK CAMP - 3rd GRADE AND OLDER

Week 1 (June 28th - July 2nd) - Sugar Crafts

- This week, campers will focus on cake decorating techniques, for example, piping, using fondant and chocolate molds, and shaping cakes.
- A cake decorating King / Queen will reign supreme in a friendly competition at the end of the week.

Week 2 (July 6th – July 9th) – DIY Studio

- Possibilities are endless when we put our hands to use. Campers will be making an array of projects: soap, Soho bag, bows/bow ties, keychains, and more.
- Families can join us for a virtual gallery on Friday to see your child's collection.



Week 3 (July 12th - July 16th) - Life-Size Video Games

- Each camper gets to design an entire game by themselves characters, props, and quests, they get to do them all. They will hand-make the characters' accessories, figurines, and even potions.
- While learning how to design a game, students will have to go through quests every day set by the camp counselor.

Week 4 (July 19th - July 23rd) - Dance Expressions

- We will focus on learning a K-Pop routine throughout the week and the final performance will be recorded and sent out to all families.

Week 1 (July 26th - July 30th) - Splish & Splash

- It would not be a great summer without water fun! Campers will be adding water to any sports and games. They will be hitting water balloon pinatas, and playing water balloon basketball.
- When they are not getting themselves wet, they will be doing science experiments, such as the walking water experiment and pencil in a water bag experiment, and learning fun facts about water.

Week 2 (August 2nd - August 11th) - Memory Treasures

- Summer is winding down and before having a fresh start in the next school year, let's put all the fond memories in a beautiful scrapbook.
- Campers will get to put pictures, decorate, and journal to create a keepsake to memorize such a special time in their lives.



SESSION 3: FOUR-WEEK CAMP - 3rd GRADE AND OLDER

Week 1 (July 26th - July 30th) - Inventor's Workshop

- Campers will get a week to design, make, advertise, and present an invention of their own.
- They will be practicing their STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) skills and public speaking skills to accomplish their goal.
- Children will also go on a virtual field trip to the company 3M to see how animals and nature inspire some of their creations.
- Families are welcome to join our virtual presentation on Friday.

Week 2 (August 2nd - August 11th) - Starlight Theater: One Student Show

- During this camp, campers will learn theatre production skills, such as costume making, music selection, scriptwriting, and editing.
- Each camper gets to pick their favorite scene from a movie or a TV show to act it out.
- They will also write their scripts for a mini-theatre show.
- Performances will be recorded and shared with families.



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GENERAL INFORMATION

ABOUT SUMMER SCHOOL

As Leonardo Di Vinci once said, "Learning never exhausts the mind." The process of learning is different for each individual. Some can remember and retain their concepts during the school year while others may need a year-round program. This year, Monticello Academy is offering a summer school program in conjunction with an open camp. The open camp will be designed and conducted by one of our summer camp counselors.

For the summer school program, students will get the opportunity to maintain and refresh their previous school year's academic program. They will learn and have fun at the same time. The summer school will reinforce their learning and prepare them for the new school year. Summer School level is determined by the student's current grade. The school will start at exactly 8:30AM each day.

ABOUT REGISTRATION

Once students register for summer school, they are expected to attend the entire session to receive the full credit for summer school completion.

- > SUMMER SCHOOL ENROLLMENT CAPACITY: Enrollment capacity is based on teacher availability. Due to CIVD-19 restrictions, we maintain a 1:15 teacher-student ratio for each grade level to ensure social distancing. Due to the limited space available, it will be first come first serve.
- CANCELLATION: Summer School will only be canceled if we are mandated to do Shelter-in-Place or if there is a lack of enrollment. In that case, all fees will be credited to your account or refunded. There will be no refund if you decide to withdraw or cancel.
